

# **BURGESS AND COMMISSIONERS OF MIDDLETOWN MARYLAND**

## ***NOMINATING CONVENTION***

**February 28, 2012**

The Nominating Convention was called to order by Burgess Pro Tempore Jennifer Falcinelli at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal Center, 31 W. Main Street, Middletown, Maryland on February 28, 2012. The purpose of this convention is to nominate candidates to fill the Burgess position and two Commissioners positions due to expire in April 2012. Mrs. Falcinelli explained that in order to hold office, you must be 21 years of age and a resident for 1 year. For those making the nomination you must be 18 years of age and a resident for 6 months. There will be no more than 2 nominations for each position, if more than 2 are nominated, a run-off election will be held immediately. If a person interested in being on the ballot and is not nominated, this person may file a petition with the Town Administrator 20 days (not including Sundays) before the election. Burgess Pro Tempore Falcinelli then asked if there were any questions, hearing none the floor was opened for nominations.

March 9 - deadline for filing a petition

March 13 – deadline for voter registration

March 23 – deadline for requesting absentee ballots

April 2 – Election Day, poles will be open 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.
