


# Community Supported Agriculture (CSA)

## Our Growing Practices

- Our animals spend most of their lives on fresh pasture
- Our beef is 100% grass-fed, and our pigs, chickens, and turkeys receive a fresh, local, non-GMO feed.
- We do not give our animals any hormones or antibiotics
- We fertilize our vegetables with compost, fish emulsion, and rock powders, rather than synthetic fertilizer.
- We never use herbicides and we only rarely resort to organically approved pesticides.
- Our farm is an open book. Come see our fields for yourself, or contact us with any questions that you have.

- Four monthly pick ups: November, December, January, February
- Fresh greens and roots from our greenhouses, delicious storage veggies, two dozen fresh eggs, pasture-raised beef, pork, and chicken, and local apples
